Main objective of the session:

UN-Habitat introduces a new tool - the CITY PROSPERITY INDEX- together with a conceptual matrix, the WHEEL OF PROSPERITY, both of which are meant to assist decision makers to design clear policy interventions. The City Prosperity Index (CPI): Includes 5 dimensions of prosperity: productivity, infrastructure, quality of life, equity and environmental sustainability. The CPI enables decision-makers to identify opportunities and potential areas along the path of prosperity. Upon consultation with different partners, UN-Habitat introduces the "Cities Prosperity Initiative", a strategic policy initiative for cities that are committed to adopt a more holistic people-centered and sustainable notion of prosperity and pledge to deploy necessary efforts and resources to move forward in the prosperity path.

Cities will become members of the initiative and will be implementing strategies to address the five dimensions of prosperity.
